

On View: 'Wardell Milan: Amerika. God Bless You If It's Good To You' at Bronx Museum of the Arts in New York

THE FIRST MAJOR solo museum exhibition of Harlem-based **Wardell Milan** confronts the hate entrenched in American society. Milan presents new works on paper that explore the daily lives of white supremacists alongside a chapel-inspired "safe space." The site-specific structure designed by Billy Ray Morgan serves as a stage for a series of collaborative performances choreographed by Milan with Zachary Tye Richardson: Black Male Body, Female Body, Trans Body, Migrant Body, and Quarantined Body. The exhibition coincides with the 50th anniversary of the Bronx Museum of the Arts, a yearlong celebration emphasizing the institution's dedication to social justice. **CT**
